QUESTION OF: The importance of global cooperation in preventing potential future pandemics.

The World Health Organisation,

1. Suggests all Member States value the importance of medically-accurate and easily accessible information during the course of a pandemic and ensure this is possible by but not limited to:
 - a. Enhancing surveillance of future pandemics in highly-populated areas,
 - b. Updating clinical management guidelines providing by the World Health Organization to best aid frontline workers,
 - c. Promoting green investment policies that create jobs during a pandemic to prevent scarring effects from a crisis while greening the economy;
2. Requests all Member States to adopt the following measures to ensure a rapid response to a health threat and adequate categorization of said threat by:
 - a. Defining a pandemic as the "worldwide spread of a new diseases" that affects a large population in more than one continent,
 - b. Defining an epidemic as a "disease that affects a large number of people within a community, population, or region,
 - c. Emphasizing the importance of the distinction between epidemic and pandemic in regards to Member States' policies concerning travel, social distancing policies, and mask mandates;
3. Calls for the creation of a unified sub-section of all global centers for disease controls by:
 - a. Creating a unified headquarters,
 - b. Maintaining all current centers for disease control globally,
 - c. Sharing data and providing resources,
 - d. Increasing cooperation and transparency on reporting of new diseases,
 - e. Increasing funding for experimental research into vaccines and treatment programs for existing diseases,
 - f. Increasing research into the spread of pandemics;
4. Recommends Member States build and increase industrial livestock raising to prevent trading and consuming of infected animals by:
 - a. Ensuring the regular examination of refreshments facilities,
 - b. Encouraging industrial livestock raising facilities to do health check ups to animals and report the results to the related ministries on a regular basis;
5. Encourages Member States to take measures to address the importance of global cooperation in preventing potential future pandemics, such as, but not limited to:

- a. Sharing any and all information discovered about the ongoing pandemic,
 - b. Raising awareness about the issue and making sure that no one is misinformed by:
 - i. Starting a social media campaign and making public broadcasts,
 - ii. Recruiting volunteers and encouraging people to participate in public events,
 - c. Financing the search for a cure and, if said cure is a vaccine, encouraging people to get vaccinated, through increased community teaching efforts,
 - d. Helping less economically developed countries by:
 - i. Raising funds and encouraging people to donate,
 - ii. Sending them food, medicines, and hygiene products;
6. Encourages all Member States take quick and effective action when a virus disease is detected anywhere around the globe, learning from the previous COVID-19 pandemic by:
- a. Applying the considered restrictions in the given country/location to avoid the virus expansion,
 - b. Alerting surrounding regions of the issue to prevent the spread, and by that a possible epidemic,
 - c. Funding for the necessity of medical and safety material against the potential new disease;
7. Recommends all Member States to have more efficient measures to prevent and control future potential pandemics, through ways such as but not limited to:
- a. Funding more investigation centers and professional teams to investigate and control any possible new disease or spread.
 - b. Acting immediately and effectively if there's a detection of a new contagious disease by taking the measures necessities such as, but not limited to:
 - i. Implementing quarantine in the affected areas,
 - ii. Supplying the civilians with mask and other necessary basic "resources" to stay safe of the disease,
 - iii. Closing borders between neighboring countries temporarily so the disease can't spread and turn into a pandemic,
 - c. Learning from the mistakes made during the current COVID-19 pandemic and creating a protocol to follow;
8. Encourages member states to work together in order to enhance the power of our response to possible future pandemics, by:
- a. Supporting and strengthening the One Health approach by,
 - i. Spreading awareness through social media for the citizens to have a more embraced mindset about the said approach,
 - ii. Encouraging the professionals with a range of expertise who are active in different sectors, (e.g. public health, animal health, plant health and the environment) to join One Health approaches,

- b. Encouraging the MEDC's and major pharmaceutical countries to promote LEDC's and countries in need, equal access to health equipments (e.g. tests and vaccines);
