The main framework of the conference centres on 10 committees: the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC), the World Health Organisation (WHO), the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crimes (UNODC), the Security Council (SC), United Nations Education, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), United Nations Human Right Council (UNHRC), the United Nations Entity For Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UNWOMEN), Historial Security Council (HSC), United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) & North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO).

- Addressing economic inequalities resulting from Al automation in global labour markets.
- The necessity of National Carbon Taxes for major polluters, China and USA, to manage the climate crisis.

#### **Session Overview**

#### **Opening Ceremony**

The Opening Ceremony marks the official opening of the session. At the Opening Ceremony several prominent speakers will deliver a keynote speech to the session participants. The session will also be addressed by the Secretary-General, the Academic Coordinator and other members of the Executive Team.

#### **Teambuilding**

Through various activities, which are both fun and challenging, delegates will get to know the committee they will be working with throughout the conference and learn to develop the ways of working together in a team through some fun games, energisers and problem solving games.

Under the direction of experienced MUN members –chairpersons–, Team-building is geared towards creating confidence and trust within the members of the committee so they will be prepared to face all the challenges that lie ahead, being capable of discussing and building solutions together to current global topics.

#### **Discover BCN**

The Discover BCN Pack offers a great opportunity for our international participants to get to know the wonderful city that hosts the conference, Barcelona. You'll get the chance to visit La Sagrada Familia, a landmark building by the famous Catalan architect Antoni Gaudí.

#### **Debate Sessions**

During debate sessions, delegates are separated into ten committees (SC, ECOSOC, UNODC, UNESCO, UNHRC, UNWOMEN, WHO, HSC, UNEP, NATO) and proceed with the debate of the topics they have been assigned. The officers chair the debate and evaluate delegates while the admin staff help in every aspect.

#### **Social Event**

The Social Event is definitely one of the most exciting activities in any conference. Delegates are able to get to know each other at a more personal level, in a relaxed and safe environment. Music and dinner will be available for all participants.

#### **Closing Ceremony**

The Closing Ceremony will be held on April 26th. The format is similar to that of the Opening Ceremony. Speeches are made by some members of the BIMUN Team and special guests. In addition, awards are given to the best delegates of each committee. With this ceremony, the Executive Team declares the conference closed.



#### **Participants**

#### **Delegates**

There will be over 450 participants from several different countries. Delegates will be divided in different committees according to their preferences, so all participants will be mixed. Each committee will discuss different topics, which students will have the chance to prepare beforehand.

#### **Chairpersons**

Chairs play a very important role in the session. They guide and lead delegates through all stages of the session - Teambuilding, Caucusing and Debate Sessions-. Being experienced MUNers, they are in a good position to empathise with delegates, helping them along but not being too obtrusive. Each committee is expected to have two chairs, who will work together in a committee.

#### **Administrative Team**

The Admin Team is led by the Executive Team that ensures that everything works as planned.

#### **Media Team**

The Media Team is lead by the Executive Team and is responsible for ensuring comprehensive documentation of the entire conference through both videography and photography, to provide tangible memories. Additionally, they oversee the creative aspects of the conference.

# 06 Awards

#### **Best Delegate**

This award will be given to the delegate who demonstrates overall excellent skills as an international diplomat. Whoever has the ability to negotiate, speak in public, follow the procedure as well as prove that he/she has better knowledge about the foreign policy and the topic at hand than the rest, will be awarded with Best Delegate.

#### **Honorable Mention**

Honorable mentions recognise the three delegates whose performance has stood out from the rest of their committee. Whoever has contributed to making the debate more fruitful, demonstrated that they have vast knowledge on international relations and MUN procedure will be awarded an Honorable Mention.



### 07 Dress Code

#### **Formal Dress Code**

Formal dressing means suits with ties for gentlemen and suits, dresses or appropriate-length skirts for the ladies, as well as appropriate, professional footwear.

You will be expected to follow this dress code during the Opening and Closing Ceremony and Debate Sessions. It is important that you follow the dress code as it is a fundamental part of the MUN experience.

# 08 Green Conference

BIMUN ESADE has decided to become a green conference since 2022 as we strongly believe that small actions can make a big change in our society. This is why we have decided to opt for long-lasting and ecofriendly materials as well as reducing paper use during the conference. We strongly encourage you to bring your laptops and/or tablets for committee use as amendments and clauses will be presented to the chairs via email.

BIMUN ESADE's procedure is based on THIMUN's debate structure. Some specific features of BIMUN ESADE require a few adjustments and modifications, which will be explained below. These alterations are the following:

- The consequences of the absence of full-fledged draft resolutions on the proceedings
- The resulting clause-by-clause debate
- The rules governing caucus time

The main difference of procedure in BIMUN is that the debates are clause-based and not resolution-based. In many other conferences, delegates come with a draft resolution and merge their draft resolutions with the draft resolutions of other delegates during the lobbying process, thus producing a revised (merged) version that is debated during the Committee sessions.

This is not the case in BIMUN ESADE as delegates come with only a few draft clauses which they merge with other delegates' draft clauses during caucus. These revised clauses are then debated individually during the Committee sessions.

Votes are taken following each clause-debate, and if the clause passes, it is included in the Resolution, which is built together by all delegates as clauses pass. At the end of the clause-by-clause debate, a vote is taken on the resolution as a whole.

Amendments to each clause are in order during the clause-by-clause debate.

As a rule, debates at BIMUN are Open Debates, except on Amendments, and as the chairs see fit to introduce Closed Debate in the interest of debate.

Caucus is the BIMUN-equivalent of lobbying in other conferences: we use a different term to distinguish between the regular whole-resolution-merging process called Lobbying and specific BIMUN-style clause-by-clause caucusing, which is to merge individual clauses and gain the required amount of signatures in order to submit the clause to the Chair for debate. Caucus-time may be requested by delegates, if they feel the need to have quick and informal contact on a clause or on an amendment, or offered by the chairs when they feel the need arises and the flow of debate requires. It is ruled by the chairs and their ruling is final and does not necessitate a vote.
