QUESTION OF: The use of nuclear weapons in future armed conflicts and the danger they pose to the global community

The United Nations Historical Security Council,

Recognizing the efforts of the UN to negotiate a legally binding instrument to prohibit nuclear weapons, leading towards their total elimination,

Recalling sadly the use of nuclear weapons in warfare, in the bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki in 1945 and their terrible consequences,

1. Calls upon the International Atomic Energy Agency to act as a mediator in the nuclear warhead reduction process by, but not limited to:
 - a. Carrying out oversight operations in order to establish the maintenance of a gradual reduction of the total capacity of nuclear weapons possessed by respective Member States,
 - b. Establishing a group of experts made out of both IAEA and member-state representatives which will provide monthly reports on the reduction process to the Security Council;
2. Supports the amendment of the Non-Proliferation Treaty in order to enhance its legislative power and ensure member-state adherence by:
 - a. Establishing guarantees in the form of collective sanctions as a result of NPT law violations,
 - b. Encouraging Member States to impose sanctions at their discretion;
3. Calls upon the International Atomic Energy Agency to implement an international uranium tracking system:
 - a. Allowing nations to continue civilian nuclear usage and development,
 - b. Establishing a safeguard which ensures that uranium is used exclusively for civil means and prevents further development of nuclear weapons,
 - c. Requiring participating nations to send monthly reports regarding uranium usage and enrichment in an effort to ensure the proper and appropriate civilian use of uranium,

- d. Allowing IAEA supervisors to inspect any nations suspected of uranium misuse,
 - e. Allowing the Security Council to impose appropriate consequences at their discretion;
4. Remains seized on the matter.
